

## Conditions Of Entry

1. The promoters, organisers and landowners shall not be liable for any claim in respect of damage to any person, horse/pony or other property of any kind howsoever it may have been caused. It is the express condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organiser blameless and that he or she shall indemnify the organiser against any legal proceedings, actions, expenses, costs, claims, demands or damage whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur.
2. All vehicles and spectators and participants at this event take part at their own risk. The organiser of the event excludes any liability arising from accidents involving the horse/pony or rider.
3. The organiser of the event has run a health and safety risk assessment but reminds everyone at the event to be vigilant and responsible regarding their own health and safety.
4. Participants must have their own insurance cover. All competitors must sign the section on the entry form stating that they have third party insurance cover or will accept responsibility for any damage they or their animals or associates may do.
5. The judge's decision is final. Any objection must be handed to the Secretary in writing with ten pounds deposit, no later than 15 minutes after the incident. If the objection is sustained, the deposit will be returned.
6. Dress code. All competitors must wear a hard hat to the latest *British Standards* and appropriate riding boots, short or long, with defined heels. Gloves are recommended in the obstacle classes. Any suitable tack may be worn provided it is safe and correctly fitted.
7. Classes are open to all breeds of horse or pony; animals must be a minimum of 4 years of age.
8. NO WHIPS ARE ALLOWED in the obstacle classes, spurs are allowed in the adult classes.
9. Dogs must be on a lead at all times, there is no exception to this rule. Please clear up after your dog.
10. The organiser reserves the right to bar entry or ask any person to leave the show ground without giving a reason.
11. Please do not muck out trailer or lorries on the showground.
12. No galloping on the showground is allowed.
13. No refunds can be made except for cancellation of event when entry fees will be returned on receipt of SAE, less £3 for administration costs or in the case of illness/lameness the production of a Dr's or vets certificate.

## EQUI TREC

This is based on the very popular TREC competitions run by the BHS throughout the UK but with a shorter format over the three phases.

### Phase 1. Optimum Speed and Orienteering Course (POR)

#### Length of course approx 12km

A brief inspection to ensure that you are equipped for safety and are carrying some form of personal identification will be carried out. You then move to the **Map Room** where you copy the orienteering route from the master map onto your own copy before setting off along that route at a predetermined speed (usually walk and trot –6-12kms /hr) You have to arrive at checkpoints (which are not marked on the map) where you have your record card marked and are given the speed for the next section.

**Phase 1** carries 240 points, with penalty points added for not keeping to the optimum time or keeping strictly to the route. Any outside assistance in route finding or communication on the route to another will both result in elimination.

### Phase 2. Equifun Trials Course

For EQUI TREC this will be run over the Equifun course in Ring Two on return from Phase 2.

**Phase 2** carries 100 points, 10 points for each obstacle. Maximum points are given for completing the obstacle in the safest, most controlled way. Instructions for the way in which you must complete each obstacle are pinned on the obstacle for you to study as you walk the course.

### Phase 3. Control of Gaits (CG)

In this phase you have to show that you can make your horse go quickly at walk and slowly at canter along a marked corridor without breaking stride. This corridor is approx 2m wide and 75m long.

**Phase 3** carries 60 points, 30 for each gait. If you break pace or step outside the corridor you score zero. Maximum points are scored for the slowest canter and the fastest walk ratio

### Class 1 Pairs one of whom must be over 14

Entry Fee £30

### Class 2 Individual Competitors must be 14 and over

Entry Fee £20

All competitors in the TREC competition must have their own 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Insurance. Times will be given for Equi Trec- competitors must include an SAE with entries or down load times from [www.nfed.co.uk](http://www.nfed.co.uk)

## EQUIFUN

### CLASSES 3 to 7

These are classes based on the working equitation competitions found in Portugal and Europe. They encourage a partnership between rider and horse/pony in negotiating a series of obstacles and hazards, with marks given for the way each obstacle is completed.

Obstacles may include: bending poles, a small jump, a bridge, sheep pen, figure eight barrels, a gate, 'the bull', immobility, posting a letter, rein back, sideways step, labyrinth, narrow passage.

### Ring One 10am

**Class Three** Lead Rein: riders to have attained their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday but not their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday on Jan 1<sup>st</sup> 2009. Ponies any height. Entry fee £8

**Class Four** Juniors up to 14 on the 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2009 off the lead rein.

Entry Fee £8

### **Break for change of course**

**Class Five 2pm** Any age rider.

The judge will expect to see correct flying changes, rein back and sideways walk along a pole. Entry Fee £10

### Ring Two 11am

**Class Six** Juniors over 14 and not to have attained 18<sup>th</sup> birthday on Jan 1st 2009. Entry Fee £10

**Class Seven** Adult Novice. Riders 18 and over.

These classes will run concurrently and include those competing in the Equi Trec with separate prizes. Entry Fee £10

### Ring Three 11am

**Class Eight**

'Have a go'. Sword Lance Competition- your very own chance to try 'skill at arms'. Rosettes to the quickest 'run' picking up all 5 rings. Junior and Senior Sections £3 per go. Enter on the day at the ring.

### Ring Four 10.30am

**Class Nine: Control of Gaits (CG)**

'Have a go'. Rosettes to those achieving scores above 40 points. See how high a score you can obtain. Prize for the highest score at the end of the day. £3 per go at the ring.
